

## Dir Biyabir 2023 Annual Report

### OVERVIEW

#### Message From The Chairperson

In 2023 all of our projects were focused on the Northern Shewa region of Ethiopia. Northern Shewa is located within the Amhara region, and this region has been in a state of emergency since mid 2023. It is currently an active conflict zone with heavy civilian casualties and infrastructure damage. In addition the millions of Amhara civilians who were violently displaced from the Oromia region in several waves for the last 3+ years, continue to languish in various camps without adequate shelter, food or water. Even today, there is death and trauma on a daily basis in the Amhara region including the N.Shewa region where Dir Biyabir has been funding projects since 2007.

It is in this context that we find that 2023 has been yet another year where Dir Biyabir has had to shift from our mission to invest in the least privileged in their quest to lift themselves out of poverty. Instead of helping to lift up people so they may thrive, we have had to continue to focus on helping them survive through emergency relief for the displaced. Instead of building and improving infrastructure, we have had to rehabilitate what was destroyed, such as our project to rehabilitate schools looted by the terrorist group TPLF.

The devastation and need is so enormous, and our capability and scope so small that it is hard not to sink into despair. However we choose to keep our eyes on the few we can help, and we are profoundly grateful to have been able to make tangible impact on the ground. This impact is made possible due to the generous support of our members and donors,

and our highly dedicated and efficient local partner in Ethiopia, ADHENO. ADHENO has been very courageously executing our projects under very challenging circumstances, including active military conflict. We continue to stress with ADHENO that their safety is the highest priority.

In this time of despair, we thank the ADHENO team for making it possible for us to light a candle of hope

in the hearts of the suffering civilians of N.Shewa. We honor the memory of the brilliant, dedicated, compassionate, and tenacious founder and leader of ADHENO, [Dr Fisseha Haile Meskal](#), who overcame

countless obstacles to build ADHENO into a highly committed, ethical and competent organization that nurtures lives and livelihoods in Northern Shewa. Dr Fisseha passed in October 2022, but he lives on in the hearts of the thousands of farmers, students, and villagers whose lives were transformed by his work. He will always inspire and motivate us to continue his work.

In 2024 we look forward to sustainable peace based on truth and justice, so the devastation may end and we may all focus on helping the people of Ethiopia thrive and not just survive. We pray for the safety of all the people of N.Shewa and indeed all of the Amhara region and all regions with active conflict.

## Leadership Team

The Board consists of: Dr. Tadesse Wolde, Sam Smith, and Dr. Asrat Tesfayesus. We are grateful to

have continuity in our team as it ensures smoothness in our operations.

As always, all Dir Biyabir positions are voluntary and uncompensated. The Executive team continues to cover all of Dir Biyabir operational expenses, to ensure that **100% of membership fees and donations received are directly utilized to fund projects in Ethiopia.**

## MEMBERSHIP

The membership levels are unchanged and are summarized below.

- Diamond: \$1,000 per year
- Platinum: \$500 per year
- Gold: \$250 per year

Membership fees are our only reliable and consistent source of revenue to fund projects in Ethiopia so we very much appreciate all of our members. As always 100% of membership fees and donations are allocated to fund one of our grassroots projects in Ethiopia. You are of course very welcome to pay any amount beyond the levels stated above as all funds received are allocated to projects.

We are happy to see new donors join our various fundraisers and we hope they stick around and join us as members, the more members we have the more projects we can fund!

Membership is **annual** and can be renewed simply by paying membership fees any time within the calendar year. Members are strongly encouraged to renew their membership as early in the year as possible. Membership is simply a mechanism to raise funds for our projects in Ethiopia via membership fees. There are no additional responsibilities or benefits for being a member.

## PROJECT STATUS

### Northern Shewa Rebuilding

The goal of the project is to rehabilitate schools and clinics in N. Shewa that were looted by the terrorist group TPLF during their brutal invasion of the region in November 2021. Dir Biyabir launched a fundraiser on October 2 2022, and in December 2022, we sent \$50,000 to ADHENO to fund this project. In November 2023 an additional \$12,000 was sent to Adheno to fund this project. Using this funding, in 2023 The Adheno team was able to register great success in rehabilitating the following rural schools and clinic:

1. Robi Zuti Primary school
2. Hedase Primary School
3. Chare Primary School
4. Shewarobit General Secondary school
5. Shewarobit Health Station

Though Wurba Primary was on our list, Adheno was unfortunately unable to deliver any items to them due to on-going conflict. There were 3 phases for this project in 2023. In Phase 1 (March 23 2023), Adheno purchased and delivered Computers, Printers, Generator, and a Chemistry Machine. In Phase 2 (May 23 2023), Adheno purchased and delivered school furniture (desks, chairs, lab stools), and science models were delivered. In Phase 3

(October 2023), Adheno purchased and delivered exercise books, stationary materials (A4 papers), and reference books to Hedase, Chare, and Robi Zuti primary schools as well as Shewarobit General secondary school.

In their usual efficient execution and detailed reporting, the Adheno team has provided videos during the handover of these items to the schools and

clinic. These videos demonstrate just how much this material was needed by the community, and how thankful they are to get this much needed support.

Shewarobit has suffered repeatedly during the last few years due to horrific violence inflicted on the community. Sadly they have received no support to help them recover so the teachers, students, and

administrators showed huge appreciation for the little help we could provide. We had committed \$70,000 for this project, by September 2023, we had raised \$62,858. The balance will be covered out of Dir Biyabir's own coffers. The remaining funds will be sent in March 2024 for the final phase of this project. We thank all of our generous donors, and we wish much success to the teachers and students who are seeking an education under extremely challenging circumstances.

## Semain Shewa Biruh Aemiro College Scholarship Program

We are delighted that in 2023 Dir Biyabir participated in the launching of an exciting new college scholarship program. The “N.Shewa Biruh Aemiro” Scholarship Program is the brainchild of longtime Dir Biyabir member and generous supporter, Ato Eyakem Woldehanna. The goal is to support the top students in N.Shewa and ensure they get all the resources they need to succeed in their college education. In the past 2 years it has been reported by the government itself, that only 3% of students get a passing grade on the national high-school leaving exam. This dismal statistic is a reflection of how low the quality of education has sunk in Ethiopia. It is within this context that Ato Eyakem approached Dir Biyabir with a vision to support the students from N.Shewa who come almost exclusively from poor rural households, but who nonetheless managed to succeed academically.

Given Dir Biyabir’s long history in student sponsorship we were excited by this idea and we sat down with Ato Eyakem and our trusted local partner ADHENO to develop the concept and implementation details of this scholarship program. In February 2023, the scholarship program was kicked off by ADHENO in Debre Birhan during an award ceremony for the top 7 students (2 girls) in N.Shewa based on the results from the 2022 National High-School Leaving Examination. Ato Eyakem and the Dir Biyabir Chair Haeran, attended the program via zoom and gave a brief message. The first batch of students includes a young woman from Ataye, who showed remarkable resilience by earning high marks on the exam despite being displaced 3 times due to the repeated burning down of her hometown Ataye by Oromo extremist terrorists.

Each student is given a monthly stipend and a brand new laptop computer (computer given in the second year). Both are funded directly by Ato Eyakem. Dir Biyabir covers the one time cost for each student for

bedding items, sportswear, luggage, and transportation which are all required for incoming college students (tuition is free in public

universities).

The stipend will cover all essential items for the students including reference books and photo copying expenses. In

addition ADHENO follows up with each student and supports them with any challenges they face. In partnership between Ato Eyakem, ADHENO, and Dir Biyabir, this scholarship program is designed to ensure that these bright students have all the support they need, so they can focus on academics in college.

The results from this first batch of 7 scholarship students (in medicine, engineering and IT)) are impressive. Most students got only A’s and A+ with a few also getting some B’s. Hear directly from [one of them](#) . One of the 7 students got a full scholarship to the UAE and has now left the program.

On December 7, 2023 ADHENO held an award ceremony in Debre Birhan for the 2nd batch of top 7 students for the 2023-2024 academic year. This scholarship program was [featured on the radio program “Finote Shewa”](#) as one of the top new

educational initiatives in N.Shewa. In 2023 universities in the Amhara region were closed due to military conflict so only those students assigned to other universities were

able to attend. We wish them all much success.

## School Sponsorship - N.Shewa

2023 was a very challenging year for all students in the Amhara region. Many schools have been closed due to active military conflict, and civilian infrastructure including schools, homes, churches and hospitals have been significantly damaged by drone attacks. Kids have been severely traumatized by the military onslaught and the resulting civilian deaths and destruction. This is all continuing even to this day.

It is in this context that Dir Biyabir continued support for a school sponsorship program that was kicked-off in 2012. In these traumatizing times, it is especially critical that we continue to support these kids so they do not feel abandoned in their time of greatest need.

As background, this program was proposed by our local partner ADHENO to sponsor the education of girls in seven kebeles in Bassona Worana Wereda in Northern Shewa. ADHENO identified that there were many girls in the area who wanted to attend school but were unable to afford even basic school material. In 2014 Dir Biyabir had sponsored 139 elementary school girls and 28 secondary school girls, and the sponsorship program has continued ever since. Dir Biyabir sponsorship starts at 9th grade and covers all of high school, then continues to the end of university or college/technical training for each sponsored girl that continues her education.

### 2023- 2024 Academic Year

Dir Biyabir continued the school sponsorship program for the 2023-2024 academic year by supporting 2 university and 5 polytechnic college students that remain in our school sponsorship program. These are students that have been supported by Dir Biyabir from the beginning of high school. In addition, we continued to support 139 elementary school students by providing them with

stationary that their families can not afford to purchase for them. All sponsored students are girls from families who can not fund their education.

Due to the rapidly increasing inflation and associated cost of goods in Ethiopia, funding for each student was increased as follows:

- 9,930 birr per student for each of 2 university students for 2023/24 academic year. This covers books and handouts, stationary, exercise material, personal hygiene material, and transportation cost.
- 12,130 birr per student for each of 5 college students for for 2023/24 academic year. This covers books and handouts, stationary, lab material, personal hygiene material, and room rental cost.
- 1,249 birr per student for each of 139 elementary school students for 2023/24 academic year. This covers 12 exercise books, 5 pens, 5 pencils, 2 rulers, and 2 erasers for each kid.

Even during the best of times, these students are seeking an education under very challenging circumstances. They are striving to left themselves and their families out of poverty through education. Now under a state of emergency and active military conflict, these students are living and studying under immense stress. We pray for their safety and wish them much success in their academic programs.

## Emergency Fundraiser For Amhara IDP From Wellega

In December 2023 Dir Biyabir launched yet another emergency fundraiser to provide relief for Amhara civilians fleeing extreme violence at the hands of Oromo extremist terrorists in Wellega.

Though Dir Biyabir is not focused on emergency relief, the recent tragic situation in Ethiopia has required us to fund several emergency relief efforts. In February 2022 we had raised funds to provide emergency relief for Amhara civilians mostly from Wellega fleeing endless rounds of horrific terror attacks by Oromo extremists simply because of their Amhara identity. At the time of our fundraiser,

30,000 of the internally displaced people (IDP) had moved to the N.Shewa region, and of these about 9,000 were settled in the town of Debre Birhan.

In July 2023, about 4,145 of these IDP were required to move out of the city of Debre Birhan to a camp in a rural area 10 kilometers north of Debre Birhan known as Bakelo. These IDP were facing a dire predicament with no food supply in their camps. Despite the large number of NGO's claiming a presence in this camp, alarmingly NONE were providing any food relief. Thus Dir Biyabir launched another emergency fundraiser to save their lives.

As always we relied on our trusted local partner ADHENO for the implementation details. In November 2023, the program officer from ADHNEO, Isayias, visited the IDP at Bakelo to understand first hand what their situation looked like and to hear directly from the IDP themselves what their critical needs were. woman explaining their situation. She was moved from kebele 8 in Debre Birhan to the Bakelo camp and had previously received emergency aid funded by Dir Biyabir and delivered by ADHENO. She recalls with gratitude, the support Dir Biyabir had provided them in 2022 and expresses her disappointment at being forgotten now. [This young woman](#) explains their critical need for food as well as teff being a higher priority. She also describes the suffering of especially elders in the cold climate of the Debre Birhan area, and she requests mattresses and blankets for them. The close quarters has also exposed them to communicable diseases. [This gentleman](#) says what little is available should be distributed equally to all in the camp. While we agree wholeheartedly with this, we were challenged to raise enough money for the whole camp. Our fundraiser was launched in December 2023.

It is disheartening to note that most of these displaced Amhara civilians were successful farmers in Wellega. They were producing enough food to feed not only their families but also the general population. Now they are forced to wait for hand-outs and this is a tragedy for them and for Ethiopia.

The glimmer of hope is that even in these dark times, these folks are finding ways to stay productive and earn income to help themselves. Many [women like Gete](#) are weaving traditional baskets, and some men like [Ato Awel Tuha](#) are weaving Gabis (cotton blankets). Dir Biyabir closed the fundraiser in

February 2024 and [ADHENO delivered emergency food relief](#) as well as support for artisans. Details have been sent to our donors whom we thank profusely, especially

the large donations that helped us reach all the IDP at Bakelo. We pray for better times for them all.
